Key takeaways:

- Several of the **largest U.S. metro areas** — including Dallas-Fort Worth (#4), Houston (#5), Atlanta (#6), Chicago (#3), and Phoenix (#5) — have no current ACB pro bono grantees, representing significant opportunities for outreach.
- Organizations such as **Lone Star Legal Aid** and **Legal Aid of NorthWest Texas** already have active consumer/bankruptcy practices with volunteer attorney infrastructure, making them particularly well-suited candidates. [\[71\]](#) [\[72\]](#) [\[73\]](#)
